During your first year, you and your fellow WLAIP peers will benefit from special opportunities for focused academic advising from Wabash faculty and networking with alumni and staff in our award-winning Career Services Center. WLAIP students who complete the summer and first-year program receive a paid internship in the summer following their freshmen year at Wabash.

Earn a free credit toward your Wabash degree during the four-week Summer Institute.

Secure a guaranteed paid summer internship or immersion experience in 2024.

Meet upperclassmen who will become your mentors, tutors, and most importantly, friends.


Start networking with alumni and faculty early.
